# TRAVIS MILLS

**Retired U.S. Army Staff Sergeant,  
Quadruple Amputee, Author,  
Foundation Founder**

Travis Mills teaches and inspires audiences nationwide to “Never give up. Never quit.” no matter the obstacles or circumstances. Mills’ larger-than-life personality, sense of humor and incredible spirit for life engages audiences from the moment he takes center stage.

On April 10, 2012, United States Army Staff Sergeant Travis Mills of the 82nd Airborne was critically injured on his third tour of duty in Afghanistan by an IED (improvised explosive device) while on patrol, losing portions of both legs and both arms. He is one of only five servicemen from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan ever to survive quadruple amputee injuries. Thanks to his amazing strength, courage, an incredible will to live, the heroic actions of the men in his unit, the prayers of thousands, and all the healthcare providers at the Walter Reed Army Medical Center, near Washington D.C., Mills continues to overcome the obstacles of living life as a quadruple amputee. Every day is a battle, but Mills continues to astound everyone with his progress and with his amazing spirit. SSG Travis Mills is a genuine

American hero, and for his incredible sacrifice, we are forever in his debt.

In September 2013, Mills founded the Travis Mills Foundation (TMF), a nonprofit organization; formed to benefit and assist wounded and injured veterans. The Travis Mills Foundation supports recalibrated veterans and their families through long-term programs that help these heroic men and women overcome physical obstacles, strengthen their families, and provide well-deserved rest and relaxation. Since opening in 2013 TMF has hosted 434 veterans and their families. TMF supports these veterans through their nationally recognized retreat located in the Belgrade Lakes Region of Maine. Veteran families who have been injured in active duty or as a result of their service to our nation receive an all-inclusive, all-expenses paid, barrier free vacation in Maine where they participate in adaptive activities, bond with other veteran families, and enjoy much-needed rest and relaxation in Maine’s outdoors.

## 1 CONSTRUCTION LAW

### Drones, EV and AI – Oh My!

Technology is advancing at a faster pace than ever before. The construction industry is experiencing new and evolving machinery, equipment and processes with each passing year. Experts predict that artificial intelligence (AI) will replace nearly 85 million jobs in the United States by 2025 and that by 2025 there will be 75 billion connected devices in the world! This session will focus on the brave new world of technology in construction, including drones, electric vehicles (EV), AI and other technological advancements. We will discuss how technology is affecting and will continue to affect the construction industry, as well as the existing and future legal implications of technology in construction.

### Construction Claims in the Era of COVID-19:

#### Adjusting to the “New Normal” and Beyond

The world changed in early 2020. The COVID-19 pandemic has altered nearly every aspect of life since its discovery and continues to impact society and industry in disparate ways. We face many new challenges as we adapt to a constantly evolving “new normal.” The construction industry has bravely trudged on through this minefield. Adapting to a changing world has brought new challenges that the industry confronts on a weekly, daily and hourly basis. This discussion will focus on key issues facing the construction industry now and what we can expect in the near future and beyond. These topics include supply chain management, workforce concerns, vaccine mandates, COVID-19 related personal injury claims, workers’ compensation considerations, and the impact of the work-from-home model to the modern construction industry, among others.

### Killer Construction Contract Provisions in Unsettled Times

Construction contracts allocate and impose an extensive and complex variety of “killer” financial and performance risks. In the wake of COVID-19, supply chain and labor issues and other unprecedented changes in the construction world, these potentially “killer” provisions warrant heightened scrutiny and alternative approaches to minimize their potentially devastating effects. Many of these risks involve unanticipated events and/or may give rise to unanticipated and unreasonable obligations and risks. This interactive session will explore new approaches to common contract provisions as well as non-traditional provisions to protect the competitive and financial survival interests of companies and professionals in the construction and design industry.

## 2 INSURANCE LAW

### BEST PRACTICES FOR HANDLING “SPLIT” FILES

The logistics in handling liability claims with coverage issues can be confusing, counter-intuitive and overwhelming, and they must be handled intelligently or your claim and case will unintentionally blow up. This panel will discuss best practices on determining when to split files, what information can be shared between adjusters, conflicts of interest and how to best handle communications with excess carriers.

### INSURANCE 2022

What’s new in the world of insurance rulings in the last year? This session addresses pertinent insurance legal rulings over the last year and discusses how they affect the claims handling process and the potential for bad faith exposure. This timely discussion will also include COVID-19 claims, the impact of increased natural disasters / environmental changes on insurance; more personalized/manuscript insurance policies; marijuana/CBD insurance claims; the explosion of cyber claims; and the increased need for excess/umbrella coverage with out-of-control verdicts.

### CARGO THEFT AND SECURITY: HOW TO PREVENT IT, HOW TO INSURE IT AND COVERAGE DEFENSES

Economic pressures are leading to thieves becoming more innovative, particularly in the theft of food and beverage cargos. It is essential for insurance carriers and insureds to work together to protect each other from these claims. We will discuss the types of coverage currently available, the pros and cons of the same, the types of cases and the role of a dedicated claims and risk control team, and a broader strategy that helps improve driver and cargo safety and security.

### ADDITIONAL INSURED

The ability to shift risk between contractors is becoming increasingly difficult in the construction industry. Additional insured endorsements have been evolving in response to additional insured coverage requirements in construction contracts. This panel discusses the effect of various additional insured endorsements and policy exclusions, how these are changing in today’s market and how courts are interpreting the endorsements.

### 3 MEDICAL LAW

#### **Trending Now: Indemnity Claims by Hospitals Against Their Staff Physicians**

For the longest time, hospitals have been accepting vicarious exposure for some of their physicians and having to pay above and beyond the physician's policy limits to resolve claims on their behalf. However, with the consolidation of hospital systems and the consolidation of physicians into supergroups, this cordial atmosphere is receding. Hospitals are much more aggressive in trying to get their physicians to pay claims, and some have even started to bring indemnity claims against the contract and physicians who have indemnity provisions in their contracts. This session will address how this trend changes the landscape for lawyers representing either physicians or hospitals.

#### **Just the Facts: How Receptive Are Jurors to Scientific Evidence by Healthcare Providers in This COVID Era?**

Medical negligence cases, by nature, tend to have a lot of discussion about scientific studies and their validity. Are jurors more or less likely to be receptive to a defense based on a scientific study, given the controversy over such studies that we have seen develop in this pandemic environment? This presentation will delve into the use of scientific studies, juror sentiments and how to best position you for success in medical negligence matters.

#### **Nuclear Verdicts and Bad Faith Exposure**

When representing physicians, professional pride often takes center stage. Cases often are tried simply to prove that there was no negligence even though these very same cases could settle within policy limits. With higher nuclear verdicts on the horizon, does professional pride have to be put aside? This session will break down recent verdicts and address the pros and cons of when to choose trial over settling.

### 4 RETAIL AND HOSPITALITY

#### **How To Build A Better Claim Handling Process From Open To Close**

This brainstorming session will explore tools and strategies to be employed from claim inception to closure to ensure the most cost effective and/or optimal outcome at every level of the life of a claim to mitigate all aspects of claim cost. This includes conveying the fundamentals of company policy in tort claims, creating rules and checklists to follow, evidence collection, the use of letters of protection and strategies to lay the foundation for better results in litigation. Success comes from a strong foundation.

#### **Obtaining Management Buy-In**

All too often within the corporate structure, there is an unintentional disconnect between risk management and operations. Obtaining executive management's understanding and assistance is vital not only to pending claims and litigation but to minimizing future exposure as well. This session will explore a variety of practical strategies to facilitate communication, cooperation and understanding between the risk and operations departments to help management prepare for its role in litigation.

#### **Brand Reputation And Crisis Management: Are You Prepared?**

Given the volatile nature of society, the presence of 24-hour news and social media, events which garnered no publicity in the past are now subject to becoming viral on social media and the news. If something goes wrong, do you have the infrastructure and plan in place to respond immediately? In this session, we will discuss the benefits, damage mitigation and diminishing long-term litigation costs when your reputation is on the line.

### **Seconds in Command: Are We Doing Enough to Identify and Prepare Them?**

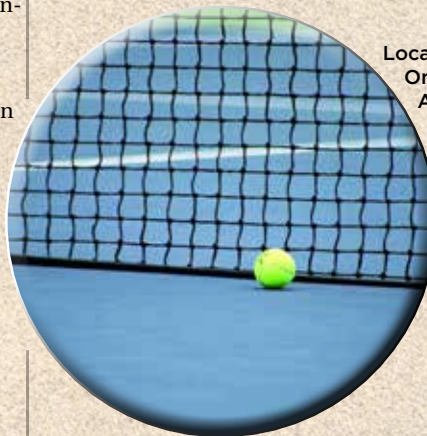

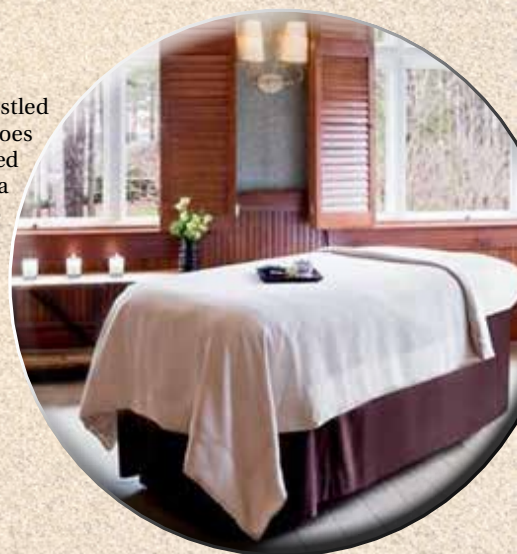

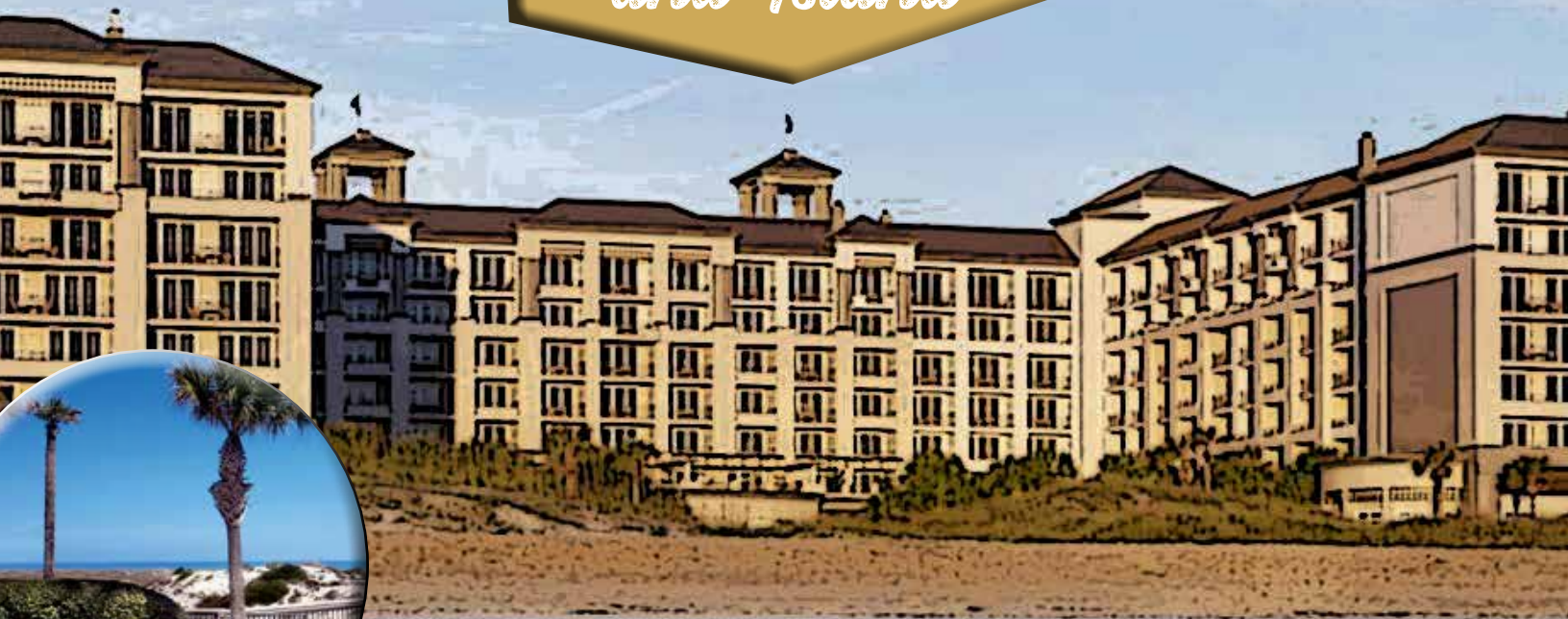
